

U.S. Survey No. 4793 was surveyed by Edward A. Taylor, Supervisory Cadastral Surveyor, in 1966.

This survey was executed by Daniel A. Wiesner, Cadastral Surveyor, July 7, 1994 through July 31, 1996, in accordance with the specifications set forth in the Manual of Surveying Instructions, 1973, Special Instructions approved June 21, 1994, the Old Harbor 14(c) Map of Boundaries, approved July 9, 1993, and Assignment Instructions dated July 1, 1994.

The azimuth was obtained from a direct observation of the sun and refers to the true meridian.

The geographic position of corner No. 1, Tract A, as determined from the record tie to the witness meander cor. No. 3, Tract E, U.S. Survey No. 4793, is:

Longitude: 153° 16' 20.34" WEST

The mean magnetic declination was obtained from U.S. Geological Survey quadrangle map KODIAK (A-4), Alaska, 1952 edition, with minor revisions in 1972.

This survey situated in Township 34 South, Range 25 West, Seward Meridian, in and around Old Harbor, Alaska.

Acceptance of this survey does not purport to transfer any interest in submerged lands to which the State of Alaska is entitled under the Equal Footing Doctrine and Section 6(m) of the Alaska Statehood Act, P.L. 85-508, notwithstanding the use, location, or absence of meander lines to depict water bodies.
