

Community Map—Maps are useful in illustrating land use patterns, land ownership, location of utilities, and also in planning for future city improvements. These maps can be prepared by surveying the land and/or by enlarging aerial photographs.

The Community Map shown here was prepared from a North Pacific Aerial Surveys aerial photograph taken in 1976 at a height of 6,000 feet, and enlarged to a scale of 1:3,000 (1"=250'). This map has been used to display the present utilities, public facilities, and residential and commercial development. In addition, other information has been portrayed which will aid in evaluating the area for new construction and city expansion. The map clearly shows how the community is dominated by Cold Bay's large runways. The developed area slopes gently toward the water and virtually all development in the town is public or commercial in nature.

This kind of data is very important in developing plans for community growth and expansion. It is useful in gaining an understanding of some of the natural and man-made features that affect the community, including flood hazards, erosion, source of water supply and location of waste disposal sites.

Note: These maps have been prepared from uncontrolled aerial photographs. Scale is approximate and minor distortion may exist. Property and utility information has been generalized from many sources and may contain minor inconsistencies. These maps should not be construed as surveys. On-site investigations should be conducted prior to construction.
