

Natural Resources of Old Harbor



Community Map—Maps are useful in illustrating land use patterns, land ownership, location of utilities, and also in planning for future village improvements. These maps can be prepared by surveying the land and/or by enlarging aerial photographs.

The Community Map shown here was prepared from a Public Health Service aerial photograph taken in 1976 at a height of 6,000 feet, and enlarged to a scale of 1:2,400 (1 in. = 200 ft.). This map has been used to display the present utilities, public facilities, and residential and commercial development. In addition, other information has been portrayed which will aid in evaluating the area for new construction and village expansion.

The Regional Map, prepared from a 1974 North Pacific Aerial Surveys photograph, taken at an elevation of 38,000 feet and printed at a scale of 1:16,800 (1 in. = 1,400 ft.), clearly shows the community and the surrounding area. This map shows that Old Harbor is a coastal community situated in an embayment on Sitkalidak Strait. A natural land bridge connects the new and old portions of the village. A steep hill rises to the west of the old section of the village. The entire area is characterized by high brush vegetation and alpine tundra. Old Harbor is surrounded by the Kodiak National Wildlife Refuge.

This kind of data is very important in developing plans for community growth and expansion. It is useful in gaining an understanding of some of the natural and man-made features that affect the community, including flood hazards, erosion, source of water supply and location of waste disposal sites.

City of Old Harbor Municipal Boundary

The description of the municipal boundaries approved by the State is as follows:

Beginning at Bush Point light on the N. shore of Sitkalidak Strait, Kodiak Island, Third Judicial District, Alaska, thence: on a line approximately N.E. 10° true, for a distance of one (1) statute mile; thence on a line approx. N.W. by W. 290° true for a distance of three (3) statute miles; thence on a line approx. S.W. by W. 247° true for a distance of six (6) statute miles; thence on a line approx. S.E. by E. 137° true for a distance of four (4) miles to point at survey station "Barclay"; thence to a point to be determined on a line between survey station "Barclay" and survey station "Natal"; said point to be determined as departure point for Director's line encompassing tide lands and to follow Northeasterly to a point to be determined on a line from Bush Point light to Survey Station "Stick"; thence from this point on said line back to Bush Point light to close the perimeter of the boundary.
