Community Map—Maps are useful in illustrating land use patterns, land ownership, location of utilities, and also in planning for future village improvements. These maps can be prepared by surveying the land and/or by enlarging aerial photographs.



The Community Map shown here was prepared from a Public Health Service aerial photograph taken in 1976 at a height of 6,000 feet, and enlarged to a scale of 1:2,400 (1 in. = 200 ft.). This map has been used to display the present utilities, public facilities, and residential and commercial development. In addition, other information has been portrayed which will aid in evaluating the area for new construction and village expansion.

The Regional Map, prepared from a 1974 North Pacific Aerial Surveys photograph, taken at an elevation of 38,000 feet and printed at a scale of 1:16,800 (1 in. = 1,400 ft.), clearly shows the community and the surrounding area. Ouzinkie is a coastal community, situated in a small cove on Spruce Island, separated from Kodiak Island by a narrow strait. The terrain surrounding the town is gently sloping and heavily forested.

This kind of data is very important in developing plans for community growth and expansion. It is useful in gaining an understanding of some of the natural and man-made features that affect the community, including flood hazards, erosion, source of water supply and location of waste disposal sites.

City of Ouzinkie Municipal Boundary

The description of the municipal boundaries approved by the State is as follows:

Beginning at a point shown on U.S. Coast and Geodetic Survey chart No. 8534 of Marmot Bay and Koonseof Strait at approximately 152 degrees 31'10"W. Longitude, 57 degrees 55'N. Latitude and designated as Uzinkie Point; thence in a Northeastly direction along the Northwesterly shoreline of Spruce Island 1/2 mile more or less to a point approximately 152 degrees 30'05"W. Longitude, 57 degrees 55'30"N. Latitude; thence Easterly in a straight line approximately 1/2 mile to a Northwesterly shoreline of a cove known and designated as Balika Basin and Cove; thence following the meander line of the South shore of Balika Basin and Cove in an Easterly direction approximately 1 mile more or less to a point at about 152 degrees 25'30"W. Longitude, 57 degrees 55'30"N. Latitude; thence in a Southwesterly direction 1/50 mile more or less to a point on the Southerly shore line of Spruce Island at approximately 152 degrees 28'10"W. Longitude, 57 degrees 54'N. Latitude; thence Northwesterly in a straight line approximately 2/5 mile to the point of beginning.
